Purpose: The End-of-Life Nursing Education Consortium (ELNEC) project is an international education initiative to improve palliative and end-of-life care. ELNEC uses an eight-module, comprehensive curriculum designed to train nurses on fundamental palliative and end-of-life skills.

Objectives:

- I. Describe the philosophy and principles of hospice and palliative care that can be integrated across settings to affect quality care at the end of life.
- II. Identify and list components of a thorough pain assessment and therapies to relieve pain.
- III. Identify and list common symptoms associated with end of life.
- IV. Apply ethical principles utilized in addressing end-of-life dilemmas.
- V. Identify and discuss the value of respecting cultural and spiritual diversity and the influence on palliative and end-of-life care.
- VI. Define the importance of communication with the interdisciplinary team, patient and family throughout the end-of-life process.
- VII. Provide interventions that may be appropriate to facilitate normal grief.
- VIII. Identify and list physical signs and symptoms of the dying process.

Target Audience: Nurses and other healthcare professionals interested in and/or practicing in the specialty of hospice and palliative care.

Cost: \$95 per person, includes lunch, snacks and program materials.
